Obtaining a Wisconsin State ID Card for FREE



Wisconsin does not issue a separate "Voter ID" card. Driver Licenses, State IDs, and some other photo IDs can be used as ID for voting purposes.

 If so, you already have what you need to vote. You don't need a State ID Card.



Do You Meet These Requirements for a FREE State ID for voting purposes?
 If not, you cannot receive a Free State ID Card.

- Wisconsin Residents Who Qualify**
- Must be at least 18 yrs of age on the date of the next election
 - Do not currently have a valid, unexpired WI Driver License (DL)
 - Do not have a WI State ID card that is not eligible for renewal (State ID cards may be renewed up to 1 yr prior to its expiration date)
 - Eligible to vote in Wisconsin

You must have one document from each column to obtain a FREE State ID For Voting Purposes. Here's what must be brought to the DMV.

Name & Date of Birth

- BIRTH CERTIFICATE (US certified)
- CERTIFICATE OF CITIZENSHIP
- FOREIGN PASSPORT (valid + i94)
- TSA WORKER ID Transportation Worker Identification Credential
- COURT ORDER: Adoption, Divorce Name or Gender

- BIRTH CERTIFICATE (US certified)
- CERTIFICATE OF NATURALIZATION
- CERTIFICATE OF CITIZENSHIP
- FOREIGN PASSPORT (valid + i94)

One Document Can Satisfy Multiple Columns

One acceptable document can be used as proof in multiple categories. Proof in each category does not necessarily mean four different acceptable documents.

Original Documents of Proof

The DMV will decline to accept any acceptable document presented if it has reason to suspect the authenticity of the document. Questionable documents may require additional review.

The same documents are required when applying for a Driver License.

You do not have to show your Social Security Card, but must provide the number.

Documents presented as proof must be original. Photocopies unless otherwise indicated are not acceptable.

Documents with a photograph of a person will be accepted only when the person is readily recognizable from the photograph.

- Complete the application: Wisconsin Driver License (DL)/Identification Card (ID)
- Don't forget to check the boxes shown below.

CHECK ONE. I am applying for: Driver License Identification Card

For ID Applicants Only – I certify that I am a United States citizen, will be at least 18 years of age by the next election and require a Wisconsin Identification Card (ID) for free in order to vote.

Once documentation is accepted the FREE State ID Card is processed and mailed. A WI State ID Card Receipt is issued that day. The WI State ID Card Receipt is an acceptable ID for voting purposes.
