

630 W. WATER STREET

St. Marie was a struggling settlement just north of Princeton in the mid 1800's. When it was evident it would not survive, many of the buildings were transported to Princeton. Structures were pulled over land by 40 yoke of oxen and 3 teams of horses. This building was one of the relocated buildings. Operated as a feed and seed store for approximately the next 100 years, the store also handled live poultry. The feed store closed in the late 1980's and various businesses occupied the site until 2008 when the Princeton Historical Society acquired the property and expanded their museum here.
