

## 101 WISCONSIN STREET

In 1927, George Kelley, Superintendent of Princeton School District and member of the Park Board, presented the idea to build a Community Hall. The site selected was in the Community Park (Old Public Square) and construction began. The Dahlke-Giese Lumberyard provided the lumber interest free. The Community Hall was dedicated at the Labor Day Celebration in September 1929. The Hall was paid for through the proceeds of weekly dances, wedding celebrations, public roller skating and community events. As area schools did not yet have gyms, the Community Hall was also used for basketball and wrestling events.
