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ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL AND RECREATE CHAPTER 11-2-1 TO BE RETITLED "REGULATION OF DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS, EXPLOSIVES AND OTHER MISSILES."

WHEREAS, the Common Council for the City of Princeton is desirous to repeal and recreate and retitle 11-2-1 Regulation of Discharge of Firearms, Explosives and Other Missiles; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PRINCETON, WISCONSIN TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

The Common Council for the City of Princeton does hereby repeal and recreate and retitle Chapter 11-2-1 to read as Regulation of Discharge of Firearms, Explosives and Other Missiles.

REGULATION OF DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS, EXPLOSIVES AND OTHER MISSILES.

(1) Discharge of Firearms Regulated:

(a) No person shall discharge any firearm, shoulder weapon handheld pistol, paintball gun, or bow and arrow, that propels B.B.'s, shot slugs, bullets, arrows, or projectiles from its chamber, barrel, clip, or a receptacle that is commonly used to align such projectiles for discharge, by mechanical, electrical, explosive, or fire ignition means, unless he/she is a police officer in the performance of duty, or unless he/she is a individual who is lawfully permitted to carry a concealed weapon pursuant to Sec. 66.0409(6), Wis. Stats, or unless he/she has written authorization shall be limited to a specific purpose, for a specific time, and using a specific weapon, previously inspected by the Chief of Police and determined to be mechanically safe for use. Notwithstanding such specific written authorization, any such weapon shall be used only with due care and with reasonable precautions against harm or danger to any person or property.

(2) Hunting Prohibited:

(a) Hunting within the City of Princeton is prohibited. Except as provided in part (b) below, this subsection (1)(a) shall be deemed to prohibit hunting within the city. Hunting within the City owned property known as the 'Old Landfill' is prohibited. Except as provided in part (c) below.

(b) The general prohibition against hunting within the city is exempted according to the rules and regulations set out below:

(1) Whitetail deer may be hunted by bow and arrow within city limits in areas approved by the Princeton Police Department.

(2) Any person wishing to hunt deer by bow and arrow within the city must register with the Princeton Police Department providing their name, photo identification, address, phone number, location for hunting, Wisconsin DNR Archery Deer hunting license, and written permission from the property owner or a signed statement indicating the hunter owns the property. From the location of the stand a three hundred (300) feet radius which may extend onto adjacent property owned by others, written permission must be obtained and provided when registering with the Princeton Police Department. Obtaining adjacent landowners permissions will provide a hunter the capabilities to gain permission for possible tracking of shot deer. Field dressing will be discussed in subsection 2(b)(2)(i).

(i) Field dressing may only occur within a designated area with the permission of the land owner if hunting on a property not owned by the registered hunter. Hunters must have permission of any landowner before tracking or retrieving deer from their property.

(3) If bow and arrow hunting on a property owned by another, a letter of consent from property owner must be present when registering with the Princeton Police Department as outlined in 2(b)(2) above. In addition if a hunter is bow and arrow hunting on a property owned by another said hunter must obtain written permission from the location of the stand a three hundred (300) feet radius which may extend onto adjacent property owned by others, written permission must be obtained and provided when registering with the Princeton Police Department. Hunting may occur within a designated area with the permission of the land owner.

(4) Hunting of deer by bow and arrow shall be done in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, and city ordinances.

(5) No release of hunting arrow may occur within two hundred (200) feet of any public or commercial building, public road, park, or residence unless the hunter owns or resides at that residence.

(6) All hunting arrows released must come from an elevated stand. An elevated stand must be at least six feet above ground level.

(c) The general prohibition against hunting on property owned by the City of Princeton, site known as 'Old Landfill' is exempted according to the rules and regulations set out below:

(1) Any City of Princeton resident wishing to hunt deer by bow and arrow on the site known as the 'Old Landfill' must register with the Princeton Police Department providing their name, photo identification, address, phone number, location for hunting, and Wisconsin DNR Archery Deer hunting license.

(2) Hunting of deer by bow and arrow shall be done in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, and city ordinances.

(3) All hunting arrows may be released from a ground blind or elevated stand. The hunter is expected to remove the hunting stand at the end of each day, no permanent stands are permitted. Complaints of a stand left on city property will result in its confiscation.

(4) All approved hunters must park along the road approaching the gate to 'Old Landfill.' Hunters must display approved permit in vehicle window to verify permission. NO motorized vehicle access is allowed on property.

(5) The property will be accessible by foot for scouting from 1 September of calendar year to the end of Wis. Archery Deer season during said calendar year. No feeding or baiting of deer is permitted.

(d) Hunting season dates for archery hunting deer in the City and approved City owned property are the same as Wisconsin DNR Archery Deer Season dates. There is no limit on the number of hunters allowed to register for City Property. The hunter must be respectful of the private property adjacent of businesses. DO NOT TRESPASS. Hunters must be courteous to each other when hunting this city property. It is a privilege for the city to provide this as an additional hunting opportunity. Problems from hunters may result in its loss.

(e) After the hunter registers the registration is reviewed and a letter of approval or disapproval is mailed to the hunter within several days. The approval letter should be retained by the hunter as proof of registration.

(3) Shooting Into City Limits:

(a) No person shall in the territory adjacent to the City discharge any firearm in such a manner that the discharge shall enter or fall within the City of Princeton.

(4) Explosive Devices:

(a) No person shall discharge or detonate any dynamite, nitroglycerin or other explosive within the City without first obtaining a permit to do so from the Common Council.

(5) Throwing or Shooting of Arrows, Stones, or Other Missiles Prohibited.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person to discharge or cause the discharge of any dangerous missile from any slingshot, bow and arrow or other means within two hundred (200) feet of any inhabited dwelling or building or any public par, square or enclosure.

(b) This subsection shall not apply:

- a. To section 2 as outlined above.
- b. To the shooting or discharging of toy arrows which have a tip made of rubber or similar material.
- c. To a supervised archery range approved by the Common Council.
- d. Within the interior of a single family dwelling.

This ordinance shall take force and be in effect upon passage and publication, as provided by law.
