1. **CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL.** Council President Kallenbach called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM. In attendance were Alderperson Roehl, Koehn, Magnus, Kallenbach, Garro, and Bednarek, Administrator Weidl and Mayor Mosolf.
2. **PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE.** The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.
3. **APPEARANCES FROM THE PUBLIC**
  - Ernie Schmidt, Cheryle Nickel, Mitch Simonson, Lee Williams, Gary Fenske, and Randy Scherbarth-Public Works Employees and Executive Assistant-read statement how their departments have found ways to balance financial needs. Asked that all departments are treated the same with respect to operations and financial accountability.
  - Charlie Wielgosh-628 S Farmer St., the cost savings of not having a City Administrator for six (6) months, then see if the position is needed.
  - Bob Michaels-218 Dodge St.,-The third full-time officer is needed. Part-time officers will not work. Asked that Alderpersons work for the City and address issues.
  - Vicki Wielgosh-628 S Farmer St.-She did a study of the cities in Wisconsin the size of Princeton to find out how many City Administrator positions were in these cities. Princeton's population is down 300 people. Citizens need to take the city back.
  - Mary Lind-227 N First St-her issues were addressed
  - Matt Schneider-472 N Clinton St.,-Open Police Officer and City Administrator positions need to be addressed. All departments have part-time workers and in his opinion they are dedicated and motivated. It is all about money and to make all departments operate more efficient.

  - a. Discussion: Police Department, officer vacancy There was a lengthy discussion. Police Chief Bargaquist spoke about the need for the third full-time officer. Citizens and Council members asked questions. Alderperson Magnus stated "We owe it to ourselves to look at the third full-time officer position".
