

330 W. WATER STREET

This stately Queen Anne Victorian home was built in 1894 for a cost of \$14,000 by the prominent banker and businessman, Elmer D. Morse, who was later elected to the State Senate in 1901. Taking only six months to complete the home construction project, this ornately decorated home features sixteen rooms, two impressive fireplaces with Italian marble tiling, built-in china cupboards, stained glass windows and pocket doors. The first floor includes the living area and maid's quarters with five bedrooms and bath on the second floor. The home is included on the State Historical Register.
