- 1) Call to order
- 2) Roll call taken  
MBOC members N. Pulvermacher, M.J. Mlodzik, and Mary Lou Neubauer, Clerk were present. Citizens (candidates) Roger Wolff and Joshua Zamzow, and Princeton Times Reporter DC Johnson
- 3) Confirmation of Voting Results from April 6, 2021 election  
The total number of voters and results tape from the April 6<sup>th</sup> election was presented and made available for viewing. There were 6 write-in votes for the Alderperson position for Ward 4. 2 votes were write-in for Roger Wolff, 2 votes were write-in for Joshua Zamzow, and 1 write-in each for two other parties
- 4) Ward 4 Alderperson – Breaking Tie for position  
The tie breaking procedures were read by the Clerk as provided in the Wisconsin Elections Administration Manual. It was explained the process used will be drawing the winning name out of a hat. Election Inspectors then left the room while each candidate wrote their name on a slip of paper and placed them in the box. Election Inspectors returned to the room and Chief Inspector Naomi Pulvermacher pulled the winning name for the position being Joshua Zamzow.
- 5) Declaration of winning candidate for Ward 4.  
Joshua Zamzow was declared the winner for Ward 4.
- 6) Certification of Winner for Ward 4.  
The Clerk certified that the process was followed as outlined in the Administrative Manual as provided by the Wisconsin Elections Commission.
