

424 W. WATER STREET

In 1933, Pastor Merrit of the Community Church approached Mrs. A.G. Giese, President of the Princeton Women's Club about starting a Library. She presented the idea to the Women's Club who favorably voted to move forward. Initially located at 545 W.

Water St., the Library continued to grow and soon relocated upstairs at 201 Short St. In 1948, a generous donation by Mrs. Emma Stern, again saw a relocation to a larger building at 432 W. Water St. Olive Doyle served as the first librarian until 1969. In the early 1980's, the Library Board again needing more space began fundraising and a new Library was soon built here.
