

432 W. MAIN STREET

The first school in Princeton was said to have been a one room school built in 1851 on Wisconsin Street with J.R. Mosher being the first teacher. There soon was the need of a larger, more centrally located school, which resulted in this two story stone school being built in 1867. As the population grew, another one room school was built on the west side of the Fox River in 1881. That building was eventually moved closer to this main building and used for the primary grades. Classes continued here until 1894 when a new school was built on Water Street. This building was then used as the Town Hall and the Princeton Fire Station.
