

## 545 W. WATER STREET

Built in 1891 by Anton Rimpler, this cream brick building was added to the State Historical Registry in 1997 and was home to Rimpler Dry Goods Store. Prior to the Depression, navy beans were sorted on-site before floating up the Fox River for processing giving Princeton the nickname "Bean Town". From 1923 into the mid 1930's, it was occupied by the American Legion Post #336 and the Public Library was upstairs. In 1935, Klotzbuecher's Bakery found a new home featuring fine cakes and pastries. Recent occupants included an auto parts store in the mid 1960's and recently floral, antique, and collectables.
