The Princeton Historical Society building was a donation. It was built around 1870. The front of the building was rebuilt in 1909 to keep it from falling down. It still has the original sides, but in order to keep the sides from falling, braces were put up every three feet. The inside rooms show Princeton from years back. One of the rooms is filled with dental equipment of a pioneer dentist, Dr. Drill. This room is a special attraction.

STONE HOUSE, 632 W. Water St., Princeton, Wisconsin 54968

There is some uncertainty as to exactly when the “STONE HOUSE” was built, but the year 1877 is a probable date. It was owned at one time by Erich Mueller, Princeton’s first mayor, and was purchased in 1984 from Mr. Mueller’s grandson, Danny Losinski.

The first plans of the Society for the house were to restore and furnish it as a typical home of the 1920’s. This has largely been completed. However, we have had to put our schoolroom and a dentist’s office (rooms not usually found in a home) in the STONE HOUSE also. In the near future the HOUSE will have to have a sister building, in order to properly display all the artifacts.

WARNKE BUILDING

The so-called Warnke Office Building at 708 W. Water St., was for many, many years the business office of the J. F. Warnke Lumber Yard. On the wall are pictures of some of the Warnkes, and other early businesses. Artifacts of the Society are also on display in this building.

Leased to the Society at a nominal fee, this year (1990) the building is being shared with the Chamber as their office and a Tourist Information Center.

PRINCETON HISTORICAL SOCIETY

The Historical Society was organized in 1982. In 1984, with the purchase of the STONE HOUSE, the Society had a home to store all the gifts which have been given to it.

Meetings are held at the Princeton Public Library on the 3rd Tuesday of each month at 7:00 p.m.
