MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) 2014 Ford Police Interceptor Squad Car

The City of Princeton will purchase the 2014 Ford Police Interceptor Squad Car for \$7,000. The City of Princeton agrees to sell this squad car back to the City of Green Lake for \$7,000 minus \$200 per month (any fraction of a month will be prorated) for each month that the City of Princeton keeps the car in their possession. The approximate time frame for this MOU is 10 months equivalent to June 2023. Once the City of Princeton receives their new squad car, the City of Green Lake, at the request of the Green Lake Police Chief, would purchase the 2014 Ford Explorer Police Interceptor Squad Car for the original sale price of \$7,000 minus the agreed amount as specified above plus the cost of title and registration back to the City of Green Lake. The City of Princeton will maintain the vehicle in the appropriate manner agreed upon by the City of Green Lake, including but not limited to oil changes as often as required by Green Lake Police Chief.

Upon acceptance and purchase by the City of Princeton, the City of Green Lake will aid in and transfer the registration and title to the City of Princeton at which time the City of Princeton will insure the squad car under their vehicle insurance policy.

The City of Green Lake may decide not to purchase the vehicle back for any reason, or if the need arises, have the vehicle returned for the agreed upon purchase price minus the monthly agreed upon costs plus title and registration back to the City of Green Lake as specified above.

Any damage to the vehicle will have to be fixed before it is returned. If the vehicle is damaged and cannot be repaired or is a total loss, whatever value above the purchase price will be paid to the City of Green Lake. For example, the valuation at time of incident was \$9,000 the City of Green Lake would be owed \$2,000 for the squad car to be deposited into the City of Green Lake's squad car replacement fund and the purchase price would be forfeited to the City of Green Lake.

The Green Lake Police Department will have access to the vehicle if needed for training and travel for Department business during the time it is in the possession of the City of Princeton.
